

Substitute Art Lesson Plan

Grade(s): all Title: Crowds —“Hey, Move Over!”

Overall objective(s)/essential(s)/SOL(s) covered in this lesson:

Create a picture of a CROWD—lots of people, pushing against each other, overlapping, lined up, or otherwise engaged in activities.

Supplies:

Motivation/Procedure: see back/attached paper also

Brainstorm: Where would you see a crowd of people? —*Walmart, movies, beach, party, playground, etc.*

•Talk about how to draw a crowd of people:

Show how to draw people (head, body, arms, legs, feet, side view)

•What does overlap mean?” —*something is in front of something else*
—*start with one person in front, draw other others behind, cannot see all of them*

What might they be saying?—*“watch out”, “move over”, “Hey!” etc.*

•Show how to write words and then draw word bubbles (callouts) around them

•Show examples

•Hand out markers (one tray per 2 students)

•Hand out mat paper

•Hand out drawing paper

Special Notes:

Only one piece of paper per child (unless there is a major problem). Try to get them to figure out how to fix it or use it.
